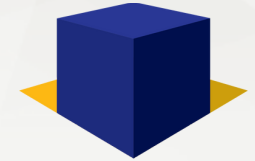
Looking forward, I am delighted to

News from Cromwell Gardens



Following our successful delivery of a £4m groundworks and infrastructure package on this 271-home development, we are pleased to say that we have also been awarded a £2.7m plot works, drainage, and S38 roadworks package at Cromwell Gardens!

This project is our first for Engie and has seen us tackle significant topographical challenges which we have overcome by working closely with our client.

Hard Ings Road improvement scheme eyed up for another award



This high-profile scheme was completed in November 2020.

A major highways project on which Howard Civil Engineering were principal contractor has been nominated for another award!

In 2020 we completed S278 works on Hard Ings Road, a major thoroughfare between Keighley and Bradford. Our works for Bradford Council on this scheme included widening the carriageway along Hard Ings Road and around Beechwood Roundabout, undertaking extensive

service diversions, and installing new traffic controls at junctions and at the roundabout, all while maintaining traffic flow.

This was a very high-profile scheme and was a key point of interest for locals

In 2021, the scheme received the prestigious John Smeaton Award for the Best Large Highways and Transportation Project 2021 for Yorkshire and the Humber from the Chartered Institution of Highways and Transportation.

The scheme has now also been shortlisted for the Institute of Civil Engineering (Yorkshire and the Humber)'s Centenary Award!

Contracts manager Tony Kilbane said: "I am thrilled to hear that it has been shortlisted for yet another award. Our entire team worked very hard to ensure that stakeholders' needs were met at every turn and this nomination is something that we are all very proud of."

Winners will be announced 25th February.

Thank you to our clients, contractors, and suppliers for helping us make 2021 so great.

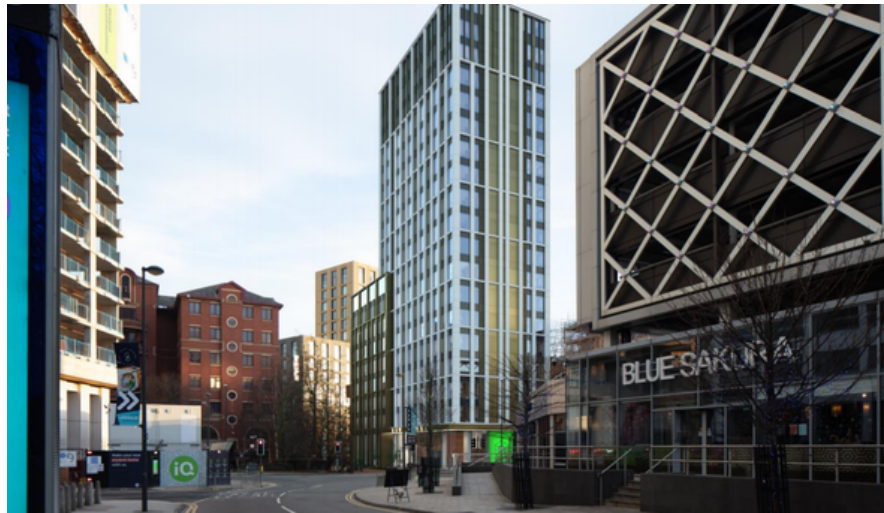

Once complete, this 20-storey tower will offer 210 studio apartments to students in Leeds.

This work includes a reinforced concrete basement, a reinforced concrete frame, ground-floor slab, and a transfer slab. At level one, the tower will then be constructed using a pre-cast concrete solution.

Representatives from FUSE have been undertaking demonstrations at several sites over the past few weeks.

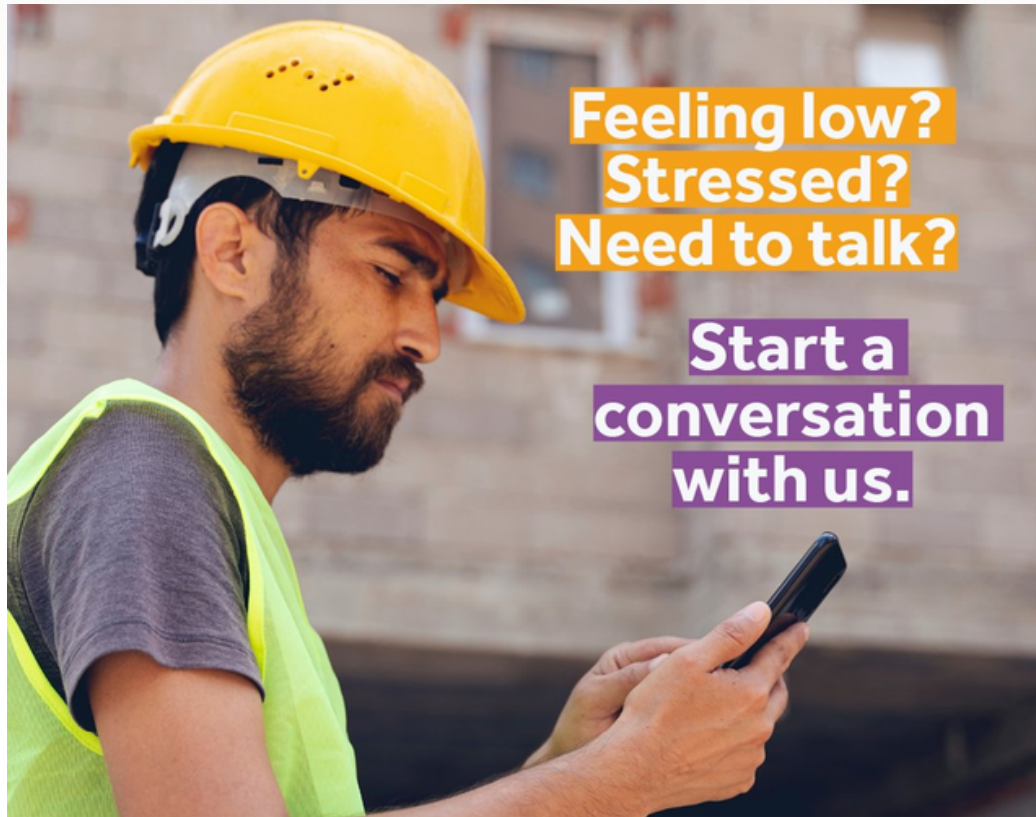

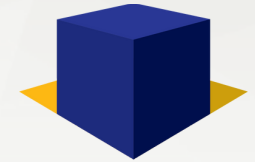

We are currently using this tool to track our fuel, electric, and water usage at our Gateway 36 site in Barnsley, and we are also tracking our electricity usage in our gas-free head office.

We are also looking forward to being 100% fuelled by solar power in our head office by the end of 2022.

Did you know our new Komatsu excavators have adjustable settings enabling operators to switch between high productivity and fuel saving?

Operators will be given eco-training to ensure familiarity with the technology and make best use of the fuel saving benefits these machines offer.

That isn't all - Komatsu can even recommend how to improve energy-saving operations based on an analysis of our usage!

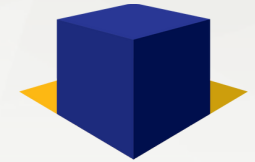
Our sights are set on safety!



At the end of last year, we purchased three dual-view dumpers which allow the operator to turn the seat and console by 180 degrees to determine the viewing and driving direction!

These dumpers guarantee maximum safety by ensuring the operator always has full visibility ahead. When unloading they can look in the direction of the skip, and before continuing to drive they can turn the seat and have an unrestricted view in the driving direction.

- Contributing £5,000 to 12 different charities as part of #12DaysofHCE, including food banks, schools, community groups, and hospitals (more on page 21).

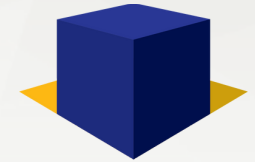
Throughout the year, Howard Civil Engineering also volunteered our services to various other initiatives.

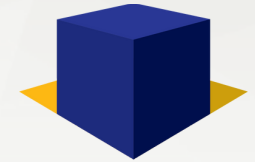
- Day 6: Food, toiletries and £200 cash to Leeds South and East Food Bank, providing 238 meals.
