Our fresh new fleet is ready for action!

Our fresh new fleet of vans are ready to go this week! In collaboration with Brandfixx, we've branded our vans using the latest and greatest modular branding technology. Not only does it look great, but the overall impact the process has environmentally is huge, and fits perfectly with our deeprooted desire for improving sustainability and CSR targets at Howard Civil Engineering!



Our new fleet was created using 70% less CO2 than the conventional wrapping process.

Our managing director, Michael Howard, chose Brandfixx for its unique modular approach to vehicle branding. Where other conventional wrapping companies take considerably more application time and resources. Brandfixx have developed a method that uses 40% less material, can be fitted in a matter of hours not days, and reduces CO2 emissions by a very substantial 73% whilst still giving full vehicle coverage, backed by DEFRA metrics!

Jack Thompson, business development manager at Brandfixx, spent the day fitting our vans with the new branding. He spoke to us about how quickly the process of branding the vans was, with him and one other colleague managing to complete nine vans in just three days! "Two fitters would normally require an entire day with constant heat gun use to complete just one van properly in a traditional wrapping method", speaking to the efficiency of their new technology!

NEW PROJECTS



Bradford City Regeneration Works

Following on from the success of our previous works in Bradford, we're incredibly pleased to announce that we have secured a new project in the form of aiding in the Bradford City Regeneration works. Specifically, we will be focused on cycling and walking improvements in the city centre.

The £3m contract, awarded by Balfour Beatty, will see us carrying out Bus intervention works in Bradford City Centre, enabling the City Core works to be carried out starting early 2024.

These works consist of widening and narrowing roads, constructing new ones (including the removal of roundabouts, adding turning circles etc), in addition to creating cycleways to enable more convenient and eco-

friendly options of travel. With these works, buses will be able to continue with their schedule on new/adjusted routes, allowing for the next stages of work to be carried out.

We will be working on multiple S278 works concurrently, enabling us to achieve the key dates we have set in advance of the City Core works.

The ultimate goal behind this project, as well as the works succeeding it, is to create large, pedestrianised areas throughout the city of Bradford. This is because, by the end of 2024, all of the city centre works - including oursare to be completed in time for Bradford being named City of Culture for 2025.

PROJECT COMPLETION



A183 Coast road

Since late 2022, Howard Civil Engineering have been undertaking a realignment of the A183 Coast Road in South Tyneside. The project has made great progress in recent months, with traffic having now been diverted onto the new road as the old one is closed. Over the course of the works, we've done our upmost to make a concerted effort collectively in keeping any disruption or inconvenience to a minimum, all whilst ensuring the protection and safety of the public is maintained at all times.

The works, which involve the A183 Coast Road being realigned by 24m to allow the adjacent cliffs to naturally erode, have been undertaken via the £1.8m contract issued by the South Tyneside Council. Now, as we enter the second half of 2023, the works are approaching their completion, hence why we've decided to place the spotlight over this project!





Because of the site's coastal location, in close proximity to local wildlife habitats, it is classed as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI)/Special Area of Conservation. Due to the nature of the work being done, some of those habitats have been temporarily removed, to be later reinstated upon the successful removal and landscaping of the former road.

As an organisation that values its efforts in sustainability and CSR, we believe it's of upmost importance that what we do here has no long-term effects on the surrounding area that may compromise its natural beauty. The above showcases an example of what we're doing at present as the project is active so maintain our sustainability status quo. However, the project also comes with its own set of longer-term benefits that are vitally important to the area...

For instance, the scheme will benefit the local community by massively reducing the risks and threats of coastal erosion for users of the A183. Additionally, it'll deliver a great environmental, social, and economic benefit as it aligns with the UK Government's sustainable development principles.

As for the final steps of the project, they too linked in with our overall environmental/CSR goals. These included busting down the old road and reinstating it with engineered fill and topsoil. Following this, landscapers can begin work on seeding the area, blending it in with the surrounding SSSI areas and preserving the site's natural beauty.

Our work on the Huddersfield Royal Infirmary is finally complete! The project involved delivering the groundworks for the construction of a new state-of-the-art A&E department after the previous one was deemed no longer fit for purpose.

The contract won was £2m in value, and the works were done for VINCI Construction. From the installation of new surface and foul water drainage, alterations to the existing drainage system, and extensive fibrereinforced concrete works, the project involved a wide array of tasks that were undertaken over a 45 week period.
